Executive Summary of SACUSP Senate Reapportionment Proposal

- 1. The existing limitation that only one career-line Senator may be elected from each college is repealed and replaced by the procedure described below.
- 2. The Senate Office will apportion *all* Senate faculty seats by the usual formula among the colleges without specifying whether they are tenure-line or career-line seats.
- 3. Each College will determine the distribution of tenure-line and career-line Senate seats through a vote conducted pursuant to their established faculty governance procedures. The designated number of Senate seats will be filled via an election subject to the following conditions:
 - a. Every college must have at least 50% of their allotted Senate seats filled by tenure-line faculty, except a college with fewer than 10 tenure-line faculty and at least 70% career-line faculty is not subject to this requirement. (Currently, this applies only to the School of Dentistry).
 - b. Every college must have at least one career-line Senator.
 - c. Subject to the above conditions, each college may fill their allocated Senate seats with any combination of tenure-line and career-line faculty as they deem appropriate and as approved in accordance with their established faculty governance procedures.
- 4. The above procedure to re-distribute career-line and tenure-line representation within a college shall be implemented on a rolling three-year basis so as to not interfere with the term of any Senator serving at the effective date of this proposal.
- 5. The Senate Policy Liaison shall shepherd the necessary policy revisions and approvals through the normal University procedures.
